Total number of visitors

From March 2020 onwards, the Czech Republic, like the vast majority of countries in the world, was impacted by the coronavirus pandemic. This resulted in a dramatic decline in tourism and, in turn, led to a huge reduction in ticket sale receipts, which are the Museum's main source of income. As a consequence of the government's restrictive regulations, the Museum had to remain closed intermittently for 115 days as of 15 March – when, under normal circumstances, it could have been open. In total, the Museum received 126,206 visitors – 551,293 (81.37%) down on the previous year. As a result, receipts from ticket sales were down year-on-year by 84.09%. This was also due to the fact that, following the outbreak of the pandemic, entry tickets were substantially reduced in price between 11 May and 31 August and between 2–17 December with a view to attracting local visitors. A larger decline was only prevented by the fact that January and February 2019 did not differ from previous years in terms of income.

At the start of the year, local visitors took more interest in discount tickets as part of the Museum's educational programme against antisemitism (which includes a tour of Prague's Jewish Town) than they did during the rest of 2020. This programme was made available on Sundays at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.

The Museum participated in the Prague City Hall's "At Home in Prague" programme, with which it managed to attract 2,774 visitors. Until the coronavirus-related restrictions in March, the Museum continued to provide discount tickets as part of the "Prague City Pass" and the "Lítačka" Prague travel card packages. Once again, the Museum's inclusion on the "Prague Card" sightseeing pass proved beneficial, attracting more than 3,000 visitors in the same period. The Museum continued to provide considerable discounts for visiting school groups through its Department for Education and Culture. The activities of the Society of Friends of the Jewish Museum in Prague also helped to successfully promote the Museum.

Finances

The Museum's financial results were considerably impacted by the coronavirus pandemic in 2020. This led to a huge drop in the number of foreign visitors and, by government order, forced the Museum to remain closed for a total of 115 days.

In total, the Museum received 126,206 visitors – 551,293 (81.37%) down on the previous year. As a result, receipts from ticket sales were down by CZK 163,262,596 (84.09%).

Total revenues were down by CZK 168,684,761 (78.25%) – less than the ticket sale decline, mainly due to an increase in income from donations and grants, and due to a smaller drop in income from term deposits.

Compared to the previous year, there was a rental income decline of CZK 4,603,916 (58.77%), which was caused by reduced sublease rates due to the closure of the Museum. Income from souvenir sales decreased by CZK 444,231 (63.92%), mainly due to the drop in visitor numbers. Nevertheless, online purchases took place through the Museum's e-shop. The interest earned on term deposits and current accounts also decreased – by a total of CZK 677,450 (18.45%). Income from gifts, grants and subsidies increased by CZK 1,969,046 (37.33%). This increase was due to wage subsidies provided by the government as part of its Antivirus Programme, the total amount of which was CZK 3,748,069.

Costs were down by CZK 55,357,950 (30.56%) compared to the previous year. This reduction was mainly due to the maximum effort that was given to create cost savings, for example by suspending planned events and purchases. Some expenses and investments, however, could not be reduced. This was particularly the case for projects that had already been elaborated, notably with regard to the work that was required to complete the reconstruction of the Spanish Synagogue and the installation of a new permanent exhibition there. In addition, it was not possible to reduce most of the fixed costs. Significant savings, however, were achieved due to the substantial reductions in rent paid by the Museum – thanks largely to the helpfulness of its landlord, the Prague Jewish Community and its property management company Matana. On the other hand, the Museum also provided rent discounts to its subtenants.

On balance, the Museum recorded substantial financial losses in 2020, with gross profit of CZK 78,906,541. Regardless of its losses, the Museum incurred a tax liability of CZK 208,330. As a non-profit organization, it is obliged to pay tax on rent and advertising income, even in this crisis situation.

The Museum's overall financial results for 2020 were down by CZK 113,326,811 compared to the previous year.



Revenues of the Jewish Museum


