

## Introduction

The Documents of Persecution represent a collection of various written records that have been gathered during a rather long period of time as gifts, purchases, or hand-made or machine-made copies of original documents being on loan.

The collection consists mainly of originals or copies of administrative archive documents and personal estates. Also, there may be found prints, newspaper clippings, maps, memoirs, and a small number of non-textual items. These documents come from various regions and mostly are products of work of particular institutions of the Protectorate or of activities of individuals.

Being continually supplemented with new additions, the collection cannot be viewed as a complete whole. It is even possible that there will be established new thematical sections.

The classification and inventarization of The Documents of Persecution as a collection divided in special sections was primarily subjected to the demand of easy orientation in all the documents. Therefore, a number of thematical sections was established, consisting of given groups of written materials. These groups were classified either by the type of documents (e.g. laws and ordinances, memoirs), or by the contents of documents (e.g. concentration camps). When regarded useful, larger groups have been divided into sub-groups of smaller or larger sets of identical or similar contents. The documents of each group or sub-group have been given a special inventory number. In particular cases the inventory number does not represent a group, but only a single written work that could not be included in any of the existing groups. According to their character, documents of a particular inventory number are classified either chronologically, alphabetically, or by their authors or owners. The inventory does not include the codes of the originators that can be found in part of the administrative written documents.

The first large group consists of several sets of laws and orders directly or indirectly concerning the Protectorate Jews. Part of them represent original prints, mostly, however, they are typed or other machine-made copies. Aside from whole sets of laws and orders classified according to the original lists, there are chronologically ordered groups classified by their editors.

Another group is formed by the written documents concerning the Treuhandstelle. Although the Treuhandstelle existed as a special division of the Prague Jewish Religious Community, it

became more or less an independent institution. Being established on October 13, 1941 by the order of the Headquarters for Emigration, this institution was subjected to the Community only administratively. The Treuhandstelle dealt with the property that had been confiscated from the Protectorate Jews: this property was classified, filed and stored by its workers.

Then there are small groups presenting the agenda of the Reich Ministry of Economy and the Reich Work Service in the Protectorate followed by the group “Jewish Emigration”. This last group consists of various fragments of documents concerning the given topic: the conference in Evian, documents of the Travel Division of the Prague Jewish Religious Community, directions for emigration, activities of the Hechaluz, various lists and reports, and documents connected with the children’s emigration transports.

In the “Antisemitic Measures” there can be found both official and private documents concerning anti-Jewish actions and measures. The group “Headquarters for Jewish Emigration” (Zentralstelle für jüdische Auswanderung) is formed only by several individual written documents. In this collection there are also statistical data, other small thematical groups, and a very differentiated group of individual documents, some of which do not concern Jews.

The “Concentration Camps” form a larger and more comprehensive group of documents concerning the concentration camps in general as well as material connected to particular camps, and the letters from the camps.

A separate group is connected with the Slovak Jews.

There are the following thematical groups: personal estates of individuals, literary production and a large collection of memoires, together with postwar literary and research work on the Holocaust of the Czech and Moravian Jews.

After the material produced by the postwar documentation activities there come fragments of documents concerning the validity of marriages contracted in the Terezin ghetto and documents concerning war criminals and collaborators.

Part of the collection is a small number of non-written items (e.g. Jewish stars), miscellanea, and forms.

The following of the above-mentioned groups have been classified in more detail in the Supplement: list of concentration camps; letters from concentration camps, prisons and ghettos; personal estates; literary production; and memoirs. The data are classified alphabetically according to their authors, owners, or localities (concentration camps). The group of memoirs include also an index of concentration camps being mentioned by their authors, and an index of names, subjects and localities.

The collection Documents of Persecution may be used as a valuable source of data connected with the history of the Holocaust of the Czech and Moravian Jews, and in a smaller extent also of the Slovak Jews. However, one should have in mind that the collection is heterogeneous, its documents are different as to their value, and given their fragmental nature they often lack their broader context. They may be used most properly if they are studied as part of research based on work with comprehensive archive materials or collections from the period of the Holocaust.
